

Blu-ray Review: Universal 100th Anniversary Titles 'Erin Brockovich,' 'Smokey and the Bandit,' 'The Sting'

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CHICAGO – Universal has slowly but consistently been releasing an amazing collection of Blu-ray combo packs (BD, DVD, and Digital Copy) throughout 2012. Spanning the entire catalog of this 100-year-old company, movies like "To Kill a Mockingbird," "The Deer Hunter," and "All Quiet on the Western Front" have been given lavish, restored treatments and "E.T." and "Jaws" will come later in the year. By the time it's done, this will be one of the most important waves of Blu-ray releases in the history of the form. This week's inclusions feature two Oscar winners and one true '70s phenomenon.




What do "The Sting." "Smokey and the Bandit," and "Erin Brockovich" have in common? Nothing but a Blu-ray release date. The underrated "Brockovich" won an Oscar for America's sweetheart, Julia Roberts, and "The Sting" was a juggernaut, winning SEVEN Oscars, including Best Picture. I like "The Sting" but it's a little nuts that it won as many Oscars as it did (the grand prize should have gone to "The Exorcist" that year). Still, people adore this film, one that features Robert Redford and Paul Newman at their charismatic best, and so it's great to see the film's fans treated so well. The restored transfer looks gorgeous in HD and the film comes with a number of interesting special features, including a documentary with interviews with the key players called "The Art of the Sting."

"The Sting" is the most popular of the three but fans of "Erin Brockovich" and "Smokey and the Bandit" should be just as satisfied. Whoever is in charge of the remastering for this wave of releases deserves a raise. I have yet to see one that disappointed in any way. They're all perfectly mixed, not over-polishing the older films to the point that they look plastic and finding just the right amount of line detail and color saturation. Even films that I don't adore feel like ones that should be added to any collection just by being a part of this landmark series.

Synopsis:




