


UPDATE: Chicago's Music Box Theatre and Gene Siskel Film Center At-Home Screenings

Music Box Theatre Presents TONI MORRISON: THE PIECES I AM, I AM NOT YOUR NEGRO, WHOSE STREETS?, THE GREY FOX, MYSTERIES OF LISBON, MYSTERY OF CHESS BOXING, MR. TOPAZE and SOMETIMES ALWAYS NEVER

Description: TONI MORRISON: THE PIECES I AM, I AM NOT YOUR NEGRO, WHOSE STREETS? is three Magnolia Studios documentaries that are biographical (MORRISON & James Baldwin in I AM NOT) and activist (STREETS are the streets of Ferguson, Missouri). One price can get all three and a portion of the box office will go towards a Small Business Relief Fund.

THE GREY FOX The 1982 classic returns. After decades in prison, stagecoach robber Bill Miner (Richard Farnsworth) emerges in 1901 a free



man without a place in 20th century society...until he sees the film THE GREAT TRAIN ROBBERY, and is inspired to once again do what he does best.

MYSTERIES OF LISBON is a six-part miniseries from Portugal, and director Raul Ruiz. The core story centers on Joao, the bastard child of an ill-fated romance between two members of the aristocracy who are forbidden to marry, and his quest to discover the truth of his parentage, but that's only the only the beginning of a engrossing tale with shades of Victor Hugo and Charles Dickens.

MYSTERIES OF CHESS BOXING (One Night Only, June 12th, 2020) is an instrumental piece of Wu-Tang lore. The old school Kung Fu movie follows Ah Pao on his journey to learn Kung Fu so he can avenge his father's death. The film is directed by Taiwanese film director Joseph Kuo, who also helmed 7 GRANDMASTERS, 36 DEADLY STYLES and 18 BRONZEMEN.

Opening on June 12th, 2020 ...

SOMETIMES ALWAYS NEVER concerns Alan (Bill Nighy), a stylish tailor who has spent years searching for his missing son Michael, who stormed out over a game of Scrabble and hasn't been seen since. The family drama focuses on the mystery of disappearance and the appreciate of what is apparent.

MR. TOPAZE is the "lost" 1961 comedy of the legendary Peter Sellers, who stars but also received his ONLY directorial credit for this film. This digitally restored British film displays the comic genius at the peak of his powers.
